PSMP - PUBLIC SAFETY MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

PSMP 4135 Principles of Emergency Services Management (3-0-3)

An examination of fire protection and emergency services; career opportunities in fire protection and related fields. This course will cover a range of academic disciplines including nomenclature, history, organizational structure, functions, cultural influences, strategy/ tactics, basic fire chemistry, and physics. This course meets the Fire and Emergency Services Higher Education (FESHE) model curriculum standards established to promote post secondary education for Fire and EMS degree programs.

PSMP 4136 Building Construction for Fire Protection (3-0-3)

This course provides students with an exploration of the components of building construction related to firefighter and life safety. It focuses on the elements of construction and design of structures shown to be key factors when inspecting buildings, preplanning fire operations, and operating at emergencies.

PSMP 4137 Principles of Fire & Emergency Services Safety & Survival (3-0-3)

An introduction to the basic principles and history related to national firefighter life safety initiatives, focusing on the need for cultural and behavior change throughout emergency services.

PSMP 4138 Legal Aspects of Emergency Services (3-0-3)

Addresses federal, state, and local laws that regulate emergency services and includes a review of national standards, regulations, and consensus standards.
